OBJECTIVES

This policy establishes the guiding principles for the creation of a long term approach and a strong foundation to reposition Geraldton's city centre as a vibrant place catering for the needs of the general community and visitors to Greater Geraldton.

POLICY STATEMENT

The policy is applicable to all of the City's formal planning processes and major projects implementation related to Geraldton's City Centre Revitalisation Plan. It also applies to any external stakeholders that play a vital role as catalysts for the City's vibrancy planning in the future. This policy should be read in conjunction with the Economic Development and Investment Attraction Policy (2.5).

POLICY DETAILS

The City Centre Vibrancy Policy focuses on increasing vibrancy of the city centre by building on existing assets and key infrastructure.

The City is committed to ensuring that its vibrancy planning and development is consistent with the following principles;

- Commitment to and ownership of bringing the vision to life through physical delivery;
- Development of a vibrant city centre offering diverse attractions and things to do;
- Creation of a place that is safe, welcoming, authentic and attractive;
- Improve access and connectivity;
- Achieve increased density and population in the city centre;
- Improve comfort and amenity of the city centre;
- Attract investment and encourage private sector redevelopment;
- Cement Geraldton as a leading regional destination in Western Australia; and
- Position Geraldton as a hub for creative industries.
