CIVIC CENTRE

Prominently located on Cathedral Avenue the building consists of a single storey administrative centre. The main construction material is exposed aggregate concrete panels which are placed vertically and extend above the flat roof to form a parapet around the building. Behind the roof parapet of the main building, an additional set of shorter panels is used to screen the building's air conditioning system. The main roof extends to cover verandahs to the south and west sides which are enclosed with decorative concrete breezeblock. The main entrance is enhanced by a long white painted concrete beam which has the words "City of Geraldton Greenough" in raised blue letters. Suspended from the beam and extending to the front entrance is an arched concrete entrance.

LIBRARY

The two storey library building adjoins the east end of the Civic Centre and is constructed in a similar style using exposed concrete aggregate panels. The structure consists of two vertically placed panels which are separated by a recessed concrete band which runs around the building. The longer upper panel extends above the flat roof to form a parapet. A series of narrow vertically ribbed two storey windows are placed to the south east and east of the building. An enclosed single storey porch enhances the main entrance. The porch has a decorative panel to the south east and breezeblock infill to the south west with the words "Public Library" in raised white letters. Inside the porch, plaques record the opening and renovation of the library.

The Town Hall was the administrative centre for Geraldton from 1907. The new Geraldton Civic Centre was opened by Queen Elizabeth II on 24 March, 1963, as is recorded on a plaque in the building. (Bain, M.A., "A Life of its Own", City of Geraldton, 1996, p303) Extensive renovations were carried out in 1987 and officially re-opened by the Queen on the occasion of the proclamation of the City of Geraldton on 22 April, 1988. (Plaque in building) The building was designed by architect Lewis Eves. A plaque on the library building indicates that the building was designed by Architects Howard Bonner and Associates and the building contractors were the Geraldton Building Company. The library was opened on 31 July, 1968 by His Worship the Mayor, C.S. Eadon Clarke Esq. J.P. (Plaque) The library was renovated and extended in 1993. The work was designed by local Architects Eastman and Poletti and the builders were Geraldton Building Company. The new extensions were opened on 26 July, 1993 by His Worship the Mayor, Mr E.J. Whelan, J.P. (Plaque in Library) The Civic Centre underwent a significant internal refurbishment in 2007 in association with the amalgamation of the City of Geraldton and the Shire of Greenough, which became effective on 1 July 2007. At present it houses several departments of the Council administration and the adjacent Geraldton Region Library, while other Council staff are accommodated at the fmr Shire of Greenough offices at Utakarra. Further renovations are planned for both the Civic Centre and the library which will be relocated to a new site. The Geraldton Civic Centre and Library was built on the site of the Queens Park Sports Ground which featured a band rotunda at the east end. (Source: Shirley Scotter)
