Approval was granted to the owner to demolish this house for redevelopment purposes in 2007. At the time of the review, the building had been gutted but walls and roofing remained intact. Situated behind a tall limestone block wall with double metal entry gates, this rendered painted brick house has a gambrel corrugated iron roof with a separate gable to the front (west) which covers the main room. The main roof extends to cover the front verandah which is supported on turned timber posts with an arched timber frieze between. Windows are timber framed and double hung with coloured glass panes to the main room.

This house, although sited behind a tall limestone block wall, contributes to the streetscape of the locale. Further the retention of decorative elements to the verandah and unusual coloured glass to the windows adds to the aesthetic significance to the place.
