The original simple stone cottage has been extended sympathetically to both ends. The corrugated iron gable roof extends to cover the front (east) verandah. The verandah is supported on timber posts and features a small gablet at the centre. The timber framed casement style windows have timber lintels and sills. A verandah also runs the length of the rear elevation.

## STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Killarney, the former Silcock Cottage, has local significance for its connection with early rural activities in the area. Further, the place is evidence of the small and simple stone buildings which were characteristic of the local farming properties before the turn of the century and of how they can be adapted to facilitate continued modern usage.
