Located on the west bank of the Greenough River, McCartney Cottage consists of the original limestone structure which has been added to with red stone to form an 'L'. The place has a hipped corrugated iron roof which is punctuated by a tall brick corbelled chimney. There is a lean-to roof to the rear which is enclosed with fibro sheeting. In recent times a brick addition has provided a large living area, while there is a small concrete block extension to the south. A pergola has been added to the west and a car port is attached to the north elevation.

Charles Crowther took up the title to VL 900 in 1876. Mrs Mary McCartney, the school teacher who taught at the old Walkaway School [Place No. 147] lived in this cottage. The estate of the late Mary McCartney containing a 4 room stone house and iron sheds was advertised for sale in 1917.
