Ellendale Pool is closely linked with the nearby Ellendale Homestead [Place No. 179] and provided an essential supply of fresh water for nearby settlers. The place has become a very popular destination for picnics and recreational activities. The eucalyptus trees (see photo GN178-2) are reputed to be planted from seed brought up from the Gingin area by Ken Logue (Source: Nancy Hamersley).
