The site of the Rectory is on CG 174, set back off Company Road behind the Temperance Lodge. [Place No. 51] The Rectory was a six-roomed stone house with a verandah. There was a well located nearby.

Walter Padbury sold VL 174 to Bishop Hale for 10/- in 1874. At a Greenough Church of England Vestry meeting in 1876 it was decided to build a Rectory on a small rise to the west of Company Road. George Heal built the rectory and stables in 1877 and John Cook sunk a well. The Rev. James Allen was the first minister to live here. The last minister to occupy the rectory was Rev. Daniel Booth in 1931. The Vince brothers removed the roof and all timber from the building in 1946.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The site of the Rectory has some historic significance for its association with the original St Catherine's Church and as evidence of the development of the Greenough Flats in the 1870s.
