Extended Trading Hours

On 1 July 2017 a 12-month trial period of deregulated trading hours (subject to Minister approval) is set to begin with the following conditions:

- a) All shops are regarded as general retail shops unless they fall under any one of the other categories including: small retail shops, special retail shops, filling - service stations or motor vehicle shops;
- b) Traders do not have to open, however may choose when they open within the specified trading hours;
- c) 8.00am 9.00pm on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday Thursday and Friday;
- d) 8.00am 5.00pm on Saturday;
- e) 11.00am 5.00pm on Sunday;
- f) 11.00am 5.00pm on public holidays;
- g) Closed on Christmas Day, Good Friday and ANZAC Day
