- A new liquor licensing applications; and
- Applications for any alterations to existing licensed premises, including hotels, taverns, cabarets, liquor stores, special facility licenses, restaurants, club licenses or for any premise as required by the Department of Racing, Gaming and Liquor.

In accordance with Section 39 of the Act, an applicant for a license is required to submit local government certificates demonstrating compliance with;

- The Health Act;
- The Local Government Act;
- The Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act; and
- Any other written law relating to sewerage and drainage.

The Issuing Officer must see evidence that:

- Certificate of Classification has been issued under the Local Government Act Building Regulations 1989.
- The building complies with the Health (Public Buildings) Regulations 1992.
- A Certificate of Electrical Compliance has been received from the electrical contractor.
- Copies of certificates issued as part of the approval process have been received, e.g. structural certificates, certificates of fire retardant treatment etc.
- Emergency evacuation and risk management plans if required, are supplied.
- Where required, a maintenance plan from the installer of a mechanical ventilation system.
- Receipt of payment of the prescribed fee has been paid for the issue of Section 39 Certificate.

It is in your interest to liaise with an Environmental Health Officer early to ensure the required documentation is available to avoid delays on issuing the Certificate of Local Health Authority.
