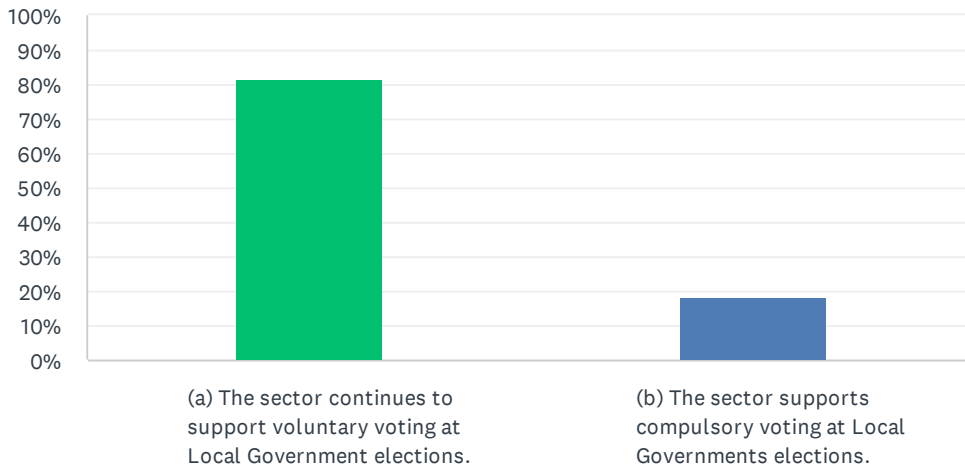


## Q1 PARTICIPATION - Select (a) or (b)

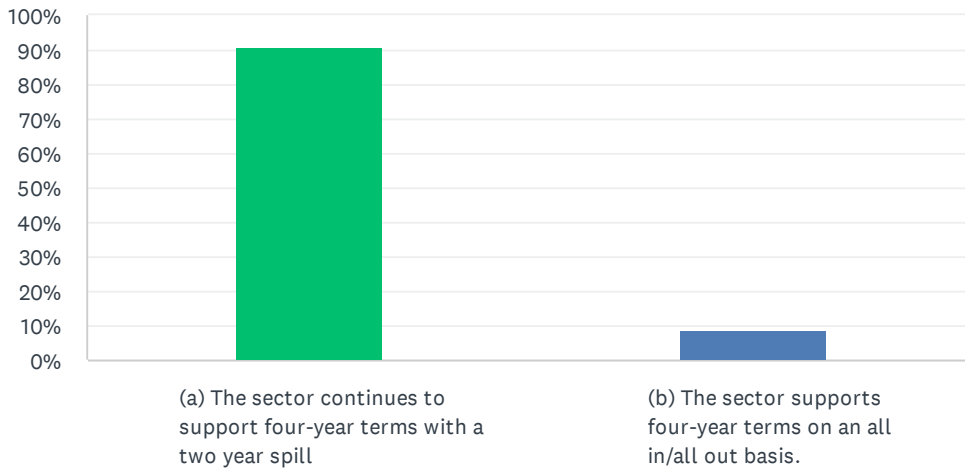

## Q2 TERMS OF OFFICE - Select (a) or (b)

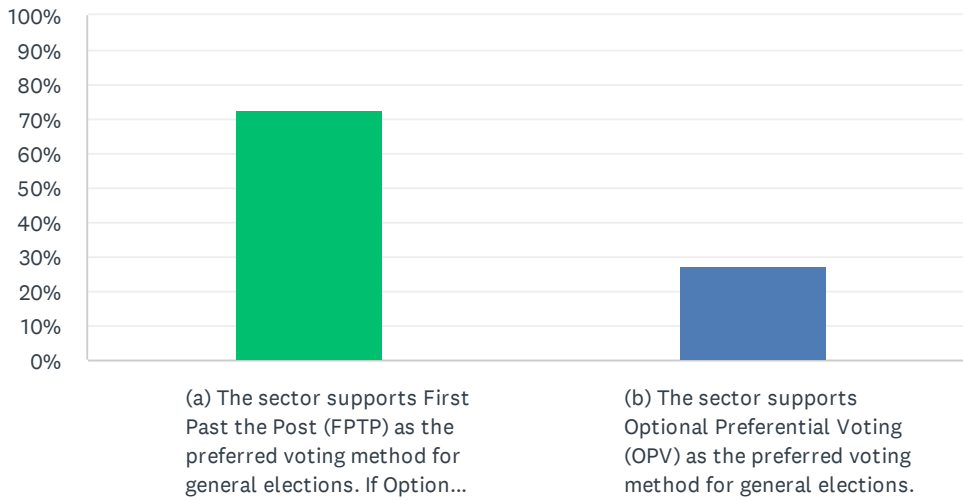

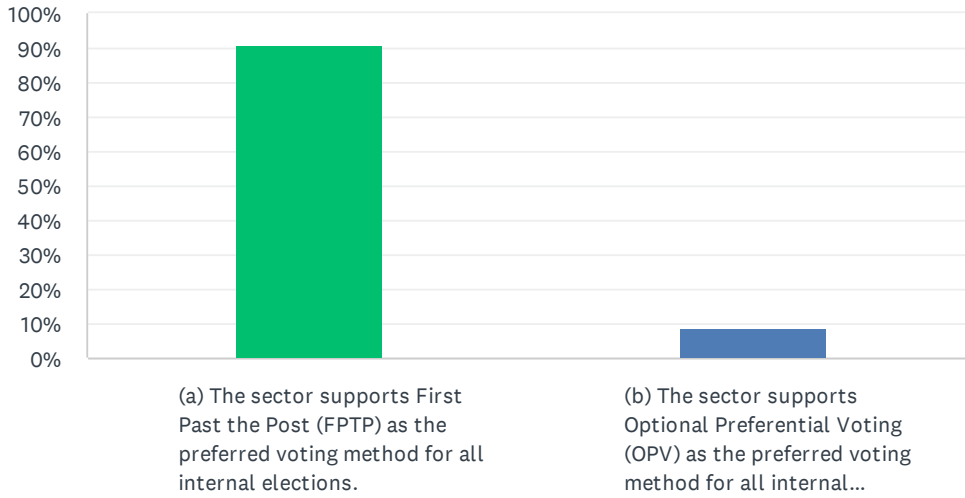

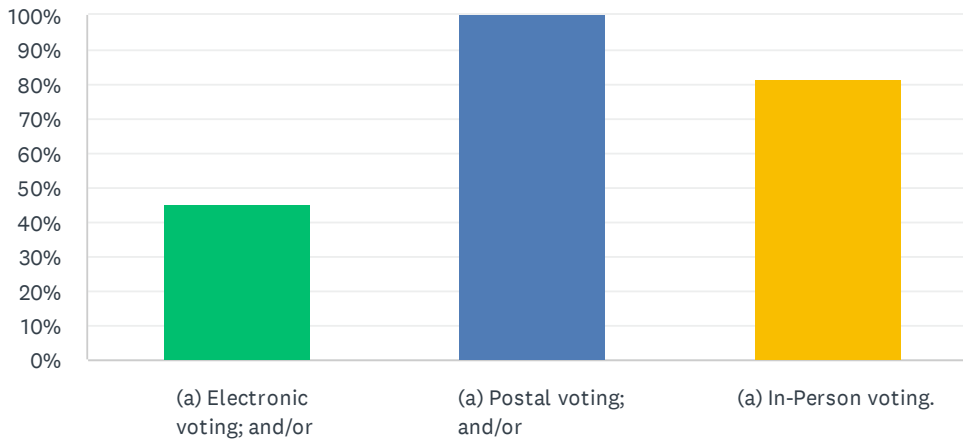

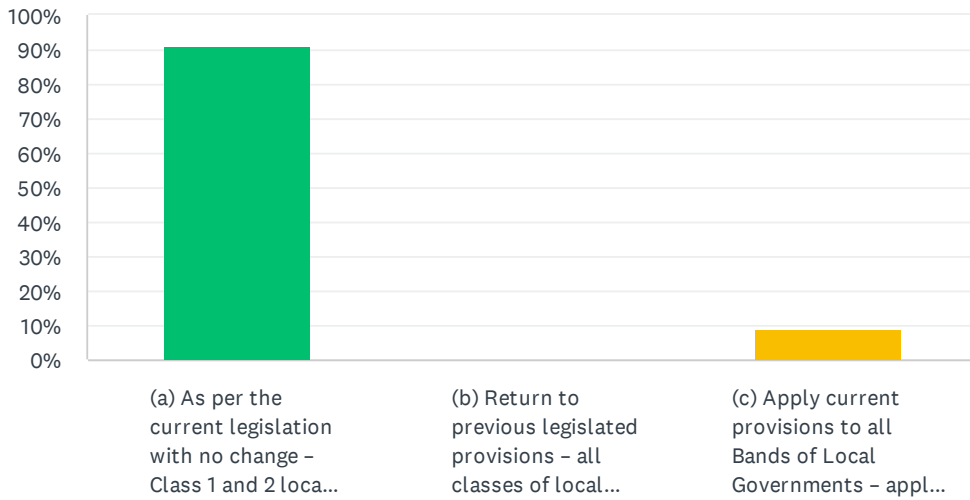
