Geraldton to salute its history as part of big heritage festival

Geraldton is set to participate in the Australian Heritage Festival next week.

The festival aims to celebrate history, with people across the country taking part in events such as walks and tours

State festival organiser the National Trust WA said it was a celebration of natural and cultural heritage

In Geraldton, locals can take part in a museum tour on Wednesday, May 15, visiting three locations in the Greater Geraldton area.

Departing from Geraldton Regional

The Geraldton Historical Society is the custodian of the cottage and members will be on site to answer questions.

The bus will then head to the Walkaway Station Museum, for a historical look at rail travel.
