# Geraldton to salute its history as part of big heritage festival

Geraldton is set to participate in the Australian Heritage Festival next week.

The festival aims to celebrate history, with people across the country taking part in events such as walks and tours.

State festival organiser the National Trust WA said it was a celebration of natural and cultural heritage.

In Geraldton, locals can take part in a museum tour on Wednesday, May 15, visiting three locations in the Greater Geraldton area.

Departing from Geraldton Regional

Library on a bus, participants will make their way to the Lighthouse Keeper's Cottage at Bluff Point.

The Geraldton Historical Society is the custodian of the cottage and members will be on site to answer questions.

The bus will then head to the Walkaway Station Museum, for a historical look at rail travel.

Last, the tour heads to the Greenough Museum and Gardens where refreshments will be provided.

City of Greater Geraldton mayor Jerry Clune said it was important to recognise the history in the area. offers a fantastic opportunity for the community to connect with the past and deepen our understanding how people lived in times gone by," he said.

"This tour will focus on settlements of Geraldton, Walkaway and Greenough, as well as their connection to each other.

"I would like to extend a heartfelt thank you to all the volunteers who have put so much work into bringing this event together and I encourage everyone to jump online and sign up whilst there are still tickets available."

The Geraldton Museum will also

host an event, focusing on Western Australia's coast.

The co-ordinator of international maritime heritage at the Netherlands cultural heritage agency, Martijn Manders, will be in Geraldton on Tuesday, May 14, to discuss the Dutch connection to WA.

Mr Manders will talk about Dutch VOC ships and the importance of the Netherlands in WA's history.
